

# Rogow MS Science Teacher and Robotics/ High Tech MakerSpace Guru!

#### Q: What do you love about science?

I love the multifaceted nature of science and enjoy exploring the myriad of life through all facets of STEAMMM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math, Metaphysics and Music). I also love seeing new technologies come to fruition from dreams that have been both long imagined and recently engineered and seeing older technologies reimagined and love to see us use those STEAMMM inventions/creations to make our lives

better...it's all fascinating to me.

# Q: As you begin your first year, what are you excited about for the students?

I'm excited to be a part of the learning process with them and assist in the magic



of exploring, drawing connections, and creating, especially in our new MakerSpace.

#### Q: Why did you become a teacher?

In a nutshell: it's in our DNA...we are all teachers after all.... I chose it as a full time career because I love the daily creativity and interaction with the students and was inspired by several really great teachers too:)

Q: What word comes to mind when you think of Schechter?







Immigrants and Refugees in Connecticut: Humanitarian Efforts Help Them Make a New Home

What happens when a refugee family comes to the U.S. and settles in Connecticut? Who helps them navigate the complex requirements and teaches them about their new community?

Join us on <u>Sunday, Sept. 10, at 7:30 pm</u> at The Emanuel Synagogue in West Hartford for a fascinating look at the process of fitting into a new culture in a new land from the perspective of an immigrant in a presentation by

Chris George, Executive Director of IRIS. IRIS, or Integrated Refugee & Immigrant Services, is the New Haven-based refugee resettlement agency that has welcomed more than 1,000 refugees to Connecticut over the last three years. Through an interactive talk and role modeling, Chris will take us through the activities that his agency uses to welcome these persecuted people and integrate them into our society.


