



8th Graders Participate in JCC Fitness Program

Thanks to a generous donation from a Schechter family, the 8th graders have just concluded a two-week fitness program, meeting with a JCC instructor once a week to participate in a 40-minute group exercise class.

The idea of the program is to familiarize students with different ways to keep their bodies physically active as they embark upon new journeys in high school. The Physical Education program throughout the



year teaches students that there are many ways to keep the body healthy; with the help of this program, students are exposed to









diverse options that appeal to all different people. In "Bootcamp" class, students competed with one another in different types of workouts, leading to the eventual crowning of a "champion."

Rogow MS Rube Goldberg Machines!

A Rube Goldberg machine is a complex machine intentionally designed to perform a simple task in an indirect and

overcomplicated fashion. These machines may consist of a series of levers, balls, or pulleys linked together to produce a domino effect, in which each device triggers the next one, and the original goal is achieved only after many steps. The middle school students wrapped



up their year by creating one of these contraptions, demonstrating their knowledge of cause and effect, gravity, physics, forces and



motion. It took students two weeks to design and create their invention, tasked with the objective of releasing a balloon into the air. Each student was responsible for a different section of the machine. A wonderful

outcome of the project was watching the students reach across grade levels to help each other with problem-solving during

construction and trials. The energy was palpable as the students prepared for the "Kickoff" of the machine!


