Building Teamwork and 'Shtetl Skills' at Hazon

Habonim (Grades 6 & 7) spent a few days at Hazon "developing 'Shtetl Skills,' i.e., life skills needed to build and maintain a community. And build they did (not surprising, since Habonim means 'the builders')! "I took away that you rely on everyone for everything, and if one person stops doing something, nothing works," **Pauline** shared. **Ari** called this the "necessity of teamwork."



They completed a bridge over a small creek, taking turns sawing wood planks and using electric drills to put screws into the planks. This bridge will last until these students are grandparents! But wait; there's more! After harvesting cherry tomatoes, oregano and kale from nearby Kaplan Farm, students divided into two groups (food-preparers and fire-builders) and made pita pizzas cooked over an open fire. We ate, were satisfied, and we blessed (Deut.8:10); and then we hiked (albeit briefly). To cap off the evening, **Mrs. Teitelbaum** and **Rabbi** were treated to an original student production of "The Singing Cephalopod of the South." Tuesday morning, the students communed with the goats and davvened with spirit. **Miriam** reflected, "I loved making goat cheese, cooking outdoors, making glass kiddush cups, and everything in-between. I hope I can go back in a couple of years and find the bridge I built." **Cooper** opined that "sometimes you need to just relax under the stars." **Talia** lamented, "I wish it was longer!"
