Art Facilitates Development in Early Childhood!

Art is an important part of the *Reggio-Emilia* philosophy of Early Childhood, and one which inspires our teaching. In **Dubonim (EC2)**, most art activities foster sensory exploration and enjoyment of the process using a variety of materials and media. That said, once in a while it is fun and fascinating to teach an art lesson to Dubonim, to measure their developmental progress and watch how they respond.



During a recent lesson on how to draw a Hanukkiyah, teachers demonstrated how to draw a horizontal line across the paper, and then add 9 vertical lines, with the middle line longer for the *shammash*. The students were shown how to add the flames to the top of each one. These types of lessons support the students as they practice focusing on a task, develop eye-hand coordination, follow directions, and notice details.

It was amazing to see how each child incorporated the lesson and created his/her own unique Hanukkiyah, even imitating the "sssss, sssss, sssss" noise of lighting the candles; some had 9 candles, some lines were vertical, some were squiggily, some had flames, and others not. Together the Hanukkiyot tell a beautiful story about the diversity of child development. That is the best part after all!

Middle School students visited the CT Historical Society this week to enhance what they are learning about American History. Examining primary documents played a big part in their day!
