The Shema is part of the *shacharit* prayers which the students recite every morning. For the last month and a half, students have focused on the Shema from varying angles, including the meaning of the prayer, *Mezuzah*, *Tefilin*, and *Tallit*. Many thanks to Rabbi Rosenbaum, the class Rabbi, who visited every Thursday to teach these lessons and enrich the students' understanding of the prayer.



This week's Shema Program began as Rabbi Rosenbaum gave the parents fascinating insights into the meaning of the Shema. As a culmination of our unit of study, students could choose to make either a bear or a *Mezuzah*. The children worked with their parents to create a tangible representation of the Shema. The program concluded with a beautiful moment: parents and children recited the prayer together.

# **Understanding Biology Through Dissection**

In science, the **Bogrim** class is learning about traits and inheritance. They dissected flowers in order to investigate whether or not they could use plants to study inheritance in people. Students examined the different reproductive parts of a flower, drew diagrams of their findings, and reassembled the parts into a labelled diagram. In discussion afterwards, students



considered similarities and differences in plants and humans to come to a conclusion about whether plants could be used to study inheritance in people.
