Middle School Launches the Year with Growth Mindset

The middle school launched the new year by learning about and integrating growth and fixed mindset (first coined by Dr. Carol Dweck from Stanford University) into everything they do. To kick off this work, students watched a short video introducing them to the two concepts and held the first of many discussions. They learned that someone with a fixed mindset



believes that intelligence is static. This leads to a desire to look smart and a tendency to avoid challenges, give up easily, see effort as worthless or worse, ignore useful negative feedback and see other's success as threatening. On the other hand, someone with a growth mindset believes that intelligence can be developed. This leads to a desire to learn and a tendency to embrace challenges, persist in the face of setbacks, see effort as the path to mastery, learn from criticism, and find lessons and inspiration from the success of others.




