The show is going to be a lot of fun. Come support your Schechter friends in this year's J Center Stage Teen Production of The Addams Family!



#### **Inspiring Others by Creating Math Videos!**

Habonim students are inspired to teach math techniques to each other! Students created math videos to explain a topic or concept. Working in groups, the students taught and learned from one another as they produced these videos.

In preparation, students watched and critiqued 3 sample

#### "Trope Aerobics"

#### Car Seat Safety : A Message from Nurse Jaime

As parents, we are so excited for every stage of development. Once pregnancy is confirmed we are thinking gender, nursery, and supplies. With all of the items that we can purchase there are very few things that are actually necessary. An infant will need nutrition, seasonally appropriate clothing, diapers and a car seat. The rest of the items are merely novelties. Each of the above mentioned can be further divided in to choice – breast versus bottle, cloth versus disposable, and the brand of car seat utilized.

No matter what style car seat you prefer, the laws are very clear. Please take a look below to learn about the different types of car seats and specifications for use.



1. Rear facing: This is the car seat that is needed for the majority of people to take their child home in. This is a five point harness providing neck support and crash stability. **Rear facing seats should be used until the child has reached 2 years old and at least 30 lbs.** For increased safety, rear facing seats should be in the middle of the second row.

2. Forward facing: Sometimes this is the same seat used from birth – but it is able to be turned into a forward facing position. This is also a five point harness that may be used after the child is 30lbs and greater than 2 years old. A child should stay in this seat until they are 40 lb and 5 years old.

3. Booster Seat: After graduating from a forward facing seat, your child is ready to move to a booster. High back boosters will be able to keep seat belt in the right position and increase comfort for your child. Your child should stay in a booster for

a longer period of time. For safety purposes, your child is not ready to graduate from a booster until he/she can sit on the seat of the car and have ideal positioning of the seat belt, without fatigue. **The minimum recommendation is to stay in a booster until 8 years old and 60lb.** 

Some things to consider are:

• Each car seat has different weight restrictions (this may mean you need a new seat - the state law prevails)

• Every child is a different build and has different needs – please make moves based on their needs

• Car seats may be difficult to install correctly – please see your local police department for support

- · Car seats should not be placed in the front seat
- · Car seats must be replaced after accident
- Car seats have expiration date and/or will expire 6 years after manufacture date

This is one aspect of our children's lives that I urge you not to rush to the next step. Take this slow!
