Connecting to MLK's Messages from a Jewish Perspective

Schechter students honored Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in meaningful and relevant ways, expanding their cross-disciplinary thinking, text analysis skills, understanding of the function of art in our society, and their empathy and compassion. Lower school students studied social protest music as was one of the most powerful forms of nonviolent protest during the Civil Rights Movement. Students sang, clapped out rhythms, and learned the connection between the spoken words of masterful orators and musicians. When Gesher students discussed MLK Jr's use of rhythmic cadence when



delivering speeches, **Anya** noted that Dr. King used long, "dramatic" pauses in his oration to deliver very powerful speeches. A highlight was hearing Mr. D as he "bent" notes according to Blues music! After performing the old spiritual "Wade in the Water," Parparim students **Avi** and **Albert** made the connection that they were using the musical technique "call and response" between the voice and guitar.

Meanwhile, middle schoolers explored the social impact of the arts by experiencing and discussing four paintings and understanding the stories behind the lyrics of protest music, then connecting these to the lives of the artists. Students read and analyzed passages from MLK's "Letters from a Birmingham Jail" and poems penned by African-Americans to highlight rhetorical style and figurative language. Connecting this learning to our Jewish traditions, students also explored the social impact of the *Mishnah* by analyzing the theme of chosen texts and connecting them to the teachings of Dr. King. **Harris** remarked, "I thought most people protested and made speeches. I did not know people made songs, paintings, and more to express their feelings and stand up against something they are passionate about." **Morissa** described the impact that the poems and writings had on her: "It is more than just words on a page. It brings you deep into the writer's mind, which allows you to step into the world they see." **Tzedkella** saw a message of hope in the day. She said, "One can find unity in inequality because when a group of people are being discriminated against, they will sometimes see each other as a community that is united as one."

Bungee Jumping in Math!

Students are collecting data on bungee jumping action figures and using algebra to predict the number of rubber bands needed for their figure to jump from a greater height and still get a thrill without hitting the floor.
