Adi Katz, Schechter's Rimonim teacher of Hebrew and Judaic Studies, was invited to speak in Manhattan about Teach First Israel and leading educational equity in Israel. As a TFI alumni, Adi shared her journey as an educator, "it began when I was accepted to a summer training that changed my life and made me a teacher." Through TFI, part of Teach for All, an offspring of Teach for America, Adi taught for 6



years in a high school in Holon, working primarily with students from low-income families. Adi says, "My students were very angry at the world. They spent a lot of time thinking that they were worthless. Being their teacher was the most challenging experience of my life, and I loved every minute of it." Schechter is so proud that Adi was recognized for her important contribution to the Israeli educational system!

Middle School Climate "Teach-In" Leads to Insight and Action

Bogrim (8th grade) and **Habonim (6th-7th grade)** students participated in a "teach-in" to lend their voices to the urgency of climate change. Bogrim watched a <u>TED Talk</u> by climate activist Greta Thunberg. **Ari**

appreciated Greta's point that there is a great understanding of climate change. He wrote, "we have the solution to climate change, we just need to initiate it." Miriam commented on Greta's point that climate change is not often covered in the news. Miriam stated, "Maybe because people just aren't willing to accept that it is happening...I think that it should be talked about because with or without realizing it my generation...will have to pick up the broken pieces left by the people before us." Habonim focused on the



impact climate change has on poverty. **Eli** wrote, "Climate change affects the impoverished mostly through the harsh ways in which it affects agriculture...agriculture is extremely sensitive to climate change, so people in poverty are especially impaired by this climate change." Eli also noted "Before, I didn't realize that there were people in the world that were actually dying and living in increased poverty without opportunities all because of climate change." After the TED talk, Bogrim began making posters to remind students what to compost and recycle in the cafeteria.


