Connecting Geography, Climate, and Tefillah

What's the connection between



geography, climate and Tefillah? Ask a Gesher student! In studying the prayer, Mashiv Haruach U'morid Hagashem, the prayer for rain in Israel that is added after Simchat Torah, the students discussed Israel's geography, its hot, dry summers and the desperate need for the rainy season that begin in the fall.

Each student then created their own cloud and raindrops. On the cloud, each student wrote in Hebrew, "Mashiv Haruach U'morid Hagashem," and for each raindrop they wrote for what purpose they dedicated the raindrop, for example, for the animals, trees, the

Kineret, desert, and drinking water.

Gesher teacher Limor Shefer noted, "it was beautiful to hear the students' conversation about Israel and their thinking about what they know and what they are wondering about. I am looking forward to weaving in more of Israel to our everyday learning throughout the year."
