Under Coach Schulz's guidance, eighth graders **Evan, Ari, Cooper, Pauline,** and **Talia** also played an important role in mentoring the younger players. For the past six weeks, Rimonim students have delved into a comparative study of Japan and Israel, including the geography, important places, weather, food, religions, and favorite sports of each country.

Students deepened their knowledge by comparing these two vastly different countries. Through an independent learning process, students learned different aspects of

each country and then taught each other while working in pairs. In addition, to culminate this study, students researched and created an exhibition after selecting a topic that was of particular interest to him or her.

For the exhibition, the students wrote a comparative essay on the topic of their choice and designed an informative poster using Canva software. This gave students a creative way to share their learning.

This unit engaged students in a variety of learning skills and habits: self-direction, responsibility, teamwork, reflective thinking, creative thinking, using drafts as a reflective process, giving and receiving constructive feedback, learning to adapt to frustrating situations, meeting goals and deadlines, and making connections to the real world.

Habonim students spent most of last week at Teva, a program hosted by the scenic Isabella Freedman Center.
